PART A) - SUMMARY REPORT

1. SUMMARY OF MAIN PROPOSALS

- 1.1 This report sets out the Committees and Boards to be appointed for the 2019/20 municipal year; the Members who will serve on these bodies; and the proposed nominees for Chair and Vice-Chair.
- 1.2 The report also invites Members to consider whether to convene a meeting of the Independent Remuneration Panel, ("the Panel").

2. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 2.1 That Council appoints the Committees and Boards, as shown at Appendix 1 of this report, for the 2019/20 Municipal Year, and approves the appointment of the Chair and Vice-Chair for each body;
- 2.2 That the Monitoring Officer be authorised to give effect to nominations to Committees and Boards notified to him in writing by Group Leaders;
- 2.3 That confirmation of the Terms of Reference for each Committee and Board be delegated to the relevant Committee or Board;
- 2.4 That an Independent Remuneration Panel be convened to consider the current scheme for members allowances and decide whether or not to recommend any changes to it;
- 2.5 That the Independent Remuneration Panel be chaired by Professor Steve Leach and that Graham Wynn OBE, as a representative of the business community and Caro Hart, as a representative of the third sector, be invited to sit on the Panel with him; and
- 2.6 That members agree to receive the final report from the Independent Remuneration Panel at Council on 19 September 2019 but that the Panel are asked to report on the basis that any recommendations made by them are backdated to be implemented from the beginning of the civic year on 24 May 2019.

PART B) – ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

4.0 INFORMATION

- 4.1 In accordance with the Constitution, the Annual Meeting of the Council will appoint such committees and boards as the Council considers appropriate to deal with matters which are neither reserved to the Council nor are Cabinet functions; will agree the size of each Committee; and will appoint a Chair, Vice-Chair, Members and substitute Members (where appropriate) for each committee and board in accordance with political balance rules. Council also notes the size of the Cabinet and the Leader's appointments of Deputy Leader and other Cabinet members
- 4.2 The various Committees and Boards to be appointed for 2019/20 are shown at Appendix 1.
- 4.3 Political balance rules have been applied where appropriate in terms of:
 - (a) the allocation of seats to political groups on each individual Committee/Board; and
 - (b) the overall number of seats allocated to each political group reflecting the relative size of each group as a percentage of the total number of Council members.
- 4.4 Group Leaders have been notified of the allocation of seats to the Committees/Boards, based on the principles set out at paragraph 4.3. Each political group has submitted nominations to its allotted seats, and the proposed membership for each Committee/Board (including substitutes where appropriate) is shown at Appendix 1.

- 4.5 Appendix 1 also shows the nominees for Chair of each body and for Vice-Chair of each body (except for Scrutiny Board/Committees), for approval.
- 4.6 Council is also asked to re-assert delegated authority to the Monitoring Officer to appoint Members to Committees and Boards in consultation with Group Leaders as notified in writing. This delegation avoids the necessity to refer each nomination to Council and it is effectively an administrative task. If the delegation is approved, the Monitoring Officer must give effect to the nomination, provided it is lawful and not contrary to the Council's own procedure rules or when the appointment is exercisable only by the Cabinet.
- 4.7 The Constitution requires Council to agree the Terms of Reference of all Committees and Boards. It is recommended that each Committee be authorised to review its own Terms of Reference.
- 4.8 The Council has an advisory Independent Remuneration Panel to review and provide advice on Members Allowances. The Panel last met and made recommendations for consideration by Council in April 2010 and the scheme of allowances, as detailed at Appendix 2, was agreed at that meeting and has been in operation ever since.
- 4.9 The allowances scheme can no longer take into account indexation provisions and best practice recommends that the scheme be reviewed every four years. Allied to the fact that the role of Councillor and the remit/ relative workloads of some of the Boards and Committees has changed since the introduction of the current scheme, the Monitoring Officer strongly recommends that the Panel be re-convened to consider and update the scheme.
- 4.10 There are a number of options for agreeing the size and constitution of the Panel but, attached at Appendix 3, is a proposal for the make-up and terms of reference of the Panel for Members' consideration.
- 4.11 If the Council agrees that the Panel should be re-convened then it is recommended that the Panel is established as soon as possible and invited to report back to the next meeting of Council on 19 September 2019.
- 4.12 The Council has discretion whether to accept the report of the Independent Remuneration Panel in its entirety, in part or to reject it. The Council must also decide the effective date for implementation of the recommendations which may vary between different recommendations. Recommendations may be backdated.

Members' Remuneration Scheme

Explanatory Comment

The Members Remuneration Scheme set out below is as approved by the Council in April 2010. The Council received a report from an Independent Remuneration and Allowances Panel which recommended a revised Remuneration Scheme for the Authority.

Remuneration Scheme

The Members Remuneration Scheme 2010/11 provided for:-

- All Members to receive a basic allowance, currently £7,870
- The following positions attract a special responsibility allowance (in addition to the basic allowance).

Deputy Leader	£15,898.00

Chairman of Scrutiny Committees	£ 7,139.00

- The scheme provides for travel, subsistence, childcare and dependant carers allowances to also be claimed by Members.
- It is a condition of the Scheme that a Member can receive no more than one Special Responsibility Allowance even if he/she occupies more than one position which has a Special Responsibility Allowance entitlement.
- The Scheme allows for an annual uprating of the Basic Allowance and Special Responsibility Allowances in line with the pay award for local authority employees. The annual uprating will be applied at the start of the Municipal Year and backdated to the start of the civic year if the pay award has not been formalised by the date of Annual Council.
- The Mayor/Deputy Mayor are reimbursed expenses in accordance with **Sections 3 and 5 of the Local Government Act 1972**. The Mayor receives £4,664.00 and the Deputy Mayor £2,479.00
