BRC-11 <u>Minutes</u>

<u>RESOLVED</u> – that the minutes of the meeting of the Boundary Review Committee held on 7 February 2019 be confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

Members had previously considered this report at the meeting on 7 February 2019, when the Committee had agreed to undertake a site visit at the proposed boundary to make a more informed decision about the issues that had been raised. The site visit had taken place on Thursday, 21 February 2019.

Reflecting on the site visit and their personal knowledge of the area, some Members expressed converse views about the proposed boundary change. The view was put forward that the natural boundary was the A518 and the anticipated natural expectation of people living in the area in question would be that they were residents of Newport. This view was countered by the view that there were similar anomalies across the borough where the borough ward boundary did not match the parish boundary. The last Boundary Commission review had left some of these anomalies in the last review, focussing as it did more on parity of elector numbers. It was also noted that it was often the case that individuals resided in one parish area and used the facilities of another and also that as the proposed development was not yet completed, the views of the people living in the affected area could not currently be obtained.

Upon being put to the vote, it was by a majority:

# <u>RESOLVED</u> – that the Final Recommendations, as shown in the document attached to the report, be adopted and published.

The Assistant Director: Governance, Procurement & Commissioning noted that the decision of the Committee would be report to the next Council meeting in July 2019.

# BRC-13 <u>Temporary Changes To Polling Stations – Local Elections:</u> Thursday, 2 May 2019

There were some 78 polling stations across the Borough, used at local and national elections, each of which was contacted in January 2019 to ensure availability for the May 2019 local elections. The report set out that two stations had declined the use of their premises, due to a change in the use of the premises or a business change preventing use as a polling station:-

- Lawley & Overdale Parish Council Offices (polling district THL)
- Lakeside Plant Centre, Priorslee (polling district TPP)

Additionally, since publication of the report, Newport Bowling Club (polling districts WNS, WNV and WSS) had temporarily declined its use for the May election only.

Members' approval was therefore sought for temporary changes to three polling stations for the May 2019 local elections:

- Lawley Village Primary Academy, Bryce Way, Lawley (polling district THL);
- Holy Trinity Academy, Teece Drive, Priorslee (polling district TPP); and
- Newport Infants School, Granville Avenue, Newport (polling district WNS, WNV and WSS

The ongoing suitability of the proposed premises as future polling stations would be assessed alongside all other existing polling stations, when a full polling station / polling place review commenced in June 2019.

Members expressed regret that the changes proposed the use of schools as this presented safeguarding issues which often resulted in school closures. The Elections Team Leader explained the alternative options that had been explored and the reasons for discounting them and was able to offer some reassurance that Holy Trinity Academy would remain open since the polling station would be set up in the adjacent sports hall. Use of Lawley Village Primary Academy would result in partial closure only but Newport Infants School would close to pupils (not staff).

Members also discussed the need to ensure ease of accessibility of polling stations and the use of demountables. Members noted that the Polling Station/Polling Place Review would commence in June 2019 and that feedback from the May election would be taken into account.

Upon being put to the vote, it was unanimously:

<u>RESOLVED</u> – that the following premises be used as polling stations for local elections:-

- (i) Lawley Village Primary Academy, Bryce Way, Lawley (polling district THL);
- (ii) Holy Trinity Academy, Teece Drive, Priorslee (polling district TPP); and
- (iii) Newport Infants School, Granville Avenue, Newport (polling district WNS, WNV and WSS)

# BRC4 Review of Polling Districts, Polling Places and Polling Stations

The Service Delivery Manager, Governance & legal Services presented the report of the Assistant Director of Governance, Procurement & Commissioning regarding the review on polling districts, polling places and polling stations in Telford & Wrekin Borough and sought member approval on the proposed changes to the polling stations, the current polling stations under review were:

- 1. Lawley Village Primary School.
- 2. Ketley Bank Community Centre.
- 3. St. Patricks Catholic Primary School.
- 4. The Red Lion Annex, Holyhead, Wellington.

Member preference was that schools were used as little as possible, and that alternative sites such as portacabins and dual polling stations be considered.

Members were assured that all avenues had been explored and that the proposals would cause minimal disruptions, although the new venues, came with their own difficulties but these had been considered fully. It was confirmed that during the consultation that there had been some engagement with individuals with disabilities in order to make sure that the proposed venues were accessible for themselves as well as the wider community. It was proposed, that the following polling stations changes be used for future elections:

- 1. Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, Lawley.
- 2. Queenswood Primary School, Yates Way, Ketley Bank.
- 3. Wellington Children's Centre, North Road, Wellington.
- 4. Sir John Bayley Club. Haygate Road, Wellington.

Upon being put to the vote it was unanimously:

#### **RESOLVED – that:**

- a) That actions taken to dare in respect of consultation for those proposals set out Section 5 to this report be noted;
- b) The changes to the Polling Stations set out in paragraph 5.10 of the report be approved subject to satisfactory inspections; and
- c) Delegated authority to the Assistant Director: Governance, Procurement & Commissioning be granted to take all necessary steps to conclude the review of polling districts, polling places and polling stations in the borough prior to a further report being brought to the Boundary Review Committee for approval 3 October 2019.

#### 1. **PURPOSE**

1.1 To review polling districts, polling places and polling stations in accordance with the Representation of the People Act 1983 (as amended by the Electoral Registration and Administration Act 2013).

## 2. **RECOMMENDATION**

- 2.1 To delegate authority to the Assistant Director: Governance, Procurement and Commissioning, to advise of polling places to be used for the next election, when called, following a review of all documents received during consultation. Consultation documentation attached to the report inviting Members comments on those proposals.
- 2.2 To approve changes to polling places with immediate effect and changes to the register from 30<sup>th</sup> November 2019.

#### 4. **SUMMARY**

4.1 The Representation of the People Act 1983 (as amended by the Electoral Registration and Administration Act 2013) requires the Council to conduct a review of the polling districts, polling places and polling stations. This report asks the Committee to review the consultation responses and proposed polling places to be used for future elections.

#### 5. **BACKGROUND**

5.1 The procedure for a review of polling districts, polling places and polling stations is laid down in the Representation of People Act 1983.

The Act also lays down the guiding principles in a review. These include ensuring that all electors in a constituency have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable and that every polling place is accessible to electors who are disabled. The guidelines go on to state that every parish should be in its own polling district, and that every polling place should be in its own polling district.

The Council initiated the review by publishing a Notice of start of review on 1 July 2019. The Council then published the proposals made by the Returning

Officer for alterations. Comments were invited during a consultation period from 1 July to 30 July 2019 from electors, including those with varying disabilities. At the end of the consultation, the Council considered the comments received and will adopt an arrangement of polling districts and polling places for a period of five years, after which there is a further duty to review. Members should note that, should a further electoral review be undertaken at Borough and/ or Parish level this could necessitate a further review before five years.

The Returning Officer's draft proposals and interactive web based map of existing polling stations was the subject of the consultation. Copies of the document were deposited at Addenbrooke House for inspection, along with a copy at Southwater and on the Council's website. Copies were sent to Members of Parliament for Telford and Wrekin parliamentary constituencies, each Borough Councillor and to each parish council.

#### 6. <u>DEFINITION OF TERMS</u>

**Polling District** – A polling district is a geographical area created by the subdivision of a UK Parliamentary constituency for the purposes of a UK Parliamentary election. In England, each parish is to be a separate polling district. UK Parliamentary constituency boundaries cannot be changed by this review.

**Polling Place** – A polling place is the building or area in which polling stations will be selected by the Returning Officer. A polling place within a polling district must be designated so that polling stations are within easy reach of all electors from across the polling district.

**Polling Station** – A polling station is the room or area within the polling place where voting takes place. Unlike polling districts and polling places which are fixed by the local authority, polling stations are chosen by the relevant Returning Officer for the election. There may be more than one polling station in a polling place.

#### **APPENDIX A**

There were approximately 700 viewings on the web page in response to the consultation to Review of Polling districts, polling places and polling stations between 1<sup>st</sup> July and 30<sup>th</sup> July 2019.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2019 – email from Cllr Shaun Davies

Cllr Davies requested that 82 properties, 164 electors were moved from voting at Old Park Primary School to vote at George Chetwood Court, Dawley due to the distance to travel to vote. The streets involved included Brick Lane, Fox Field, Ashley Way and Parkland Avenue. This would require the elections team moving the streets from polling district TME to polling district TMG. Total voters attending the George Chetwood Court polling place, including the proposed electors moving polling places, were checked and this could be accommodated at this venue without any further change.

#### 4<sup>th</sup> July 2019 – email from Lorraine Gregory and James Bennett

Lorraine Gregory and James Bennett commented that the use of Lawley Village Primary Academy School was inappropriate due to government elections affecting a child's education being unethical. A new polling place has been contacted and the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints will be used as a polling place instead of Lawley Village Primary Academy School when the next election is called.

#### 6<sup>th</sup> July 2019 – email from Chetwynd Aston and Woodcote Parish Council

No comment to make.

<u>23<sup>rd</sup> July 2019 – email from Oakengates Town Council and 26<sup>th</sup> July – email from Cllr Gilly Reynolds</u> (both emails containing the same information)

The Town Council asked for the elections team to look at a bungalow on the site of Queenswood School, Ketley Bank to be used instead of the school for polling. After inspection by the Election team it was agreed that the bungalow was inappropriate for use as a polling place due to no parking while the school is open, access to the bungalow is inadequate for wheelchair/mobility scooter/child buggy use. Staff at the school confirmed that they are happy for the school to close for a day of polling.

It was also suggested that the Trench Lock electorate vote at Wilsons Auctions at Trench Lock rather than Oakengates United Church due to distance to travel to vote. The streets affected would be Wittingham Close, Oxmoor Avenue, Bakers Lock, Patchett Drive, Britton Lock, Kinley Drive and Hoop Mill. This would require the elections team setting up a new polling district, to enable a change to the existing polling station, for these electors in the current polling district of TOO. During Parliamentary elections the venue would require two polling stations as both Telford and Wrekin electors would vote at this venue.

Members of the Town Council also agreed that two polling places were required for the electors of Ketley Bank, one at the bungalow at Queenswood Primary School and a porta cabin at Ketley Grange. The bungalow has already been agreed inappropriate for use and proposed for electors to vote at Queenswood Primary School. Due to the high cost of use of porta cabins and the Elections guidance from Electoral Commission to limit the use of porta cabins and explain reasons for use of a porta cabin following an election and also the low numbers that would be voting at this proposed porta cabin in Ketley Grange this would not be an appropriate use of public money.

#### 28<sup>th</sup> July – email from Cllr Angela McClements

Horsehay & Lightmoor – The use of Lawley Village Primary Academy School was noted as inappropriate to use. Various potential polling places were inspected by the Elections team and the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints was found to be an exceptional polling place and will be used at the next election to be called.

Oakengates & Ketley Bank – agreed use of Queenswood Primary School.

Park – change of polling place from St Patrick's Catholic Primary School to The Children's Centre, North Road, Wellington agreed. The Children's Centre was inspected and was agreed to use from 2020.

Ercall – Due to the Red Lion Annex being unacceptable for polling use, the Election team visited The Sir John Bayley Club at Haygate Road and agreed that this venue was highly appropriate for use as a polling place and will be used for the next election to be called.

Malinslee & Dawley Bank – See 2nd July 2019 – email from Cllr Shaun Davies above.

Ketley & Overdale – A proposed porta cabin for polling district of TLL currently voting at The Carpenter Centre, Overdale. It is proposed to wait until a Borough and Parish ward boundary review is undertaken when this area, growing in population, may be looked at.

Ketley & Overdale – A proposed porta cabin at Wedgewood Crescent, Ketley. An explanation with regard to the porta cabin being located in Johnstone Close, Wrockwardine Wood is purely that due to no other building being available in that area for polling and a car park is available for siting the porta cabin, this area of land was chosen many years ago.

Oakengates & Ketley Bank – A proposed new polling place at Oakengates Parish Church or the Ace Martial Arts Centre, Holyhead Road, Oakengates. No reply has yet been received from Ace Martial Arts Centre but Oakengates Parish Church has responded and are happy for the elections team to visit the premises to inspect as a potential venue. A new polling district would be required to split the current TOO polling district. It may also be acceptable to wait until a Borough and Parish ward boundary review is undertaken when this area may be looked at.

Oakengates & Ketley Bank – Trench Lock residents proposed move from Oakengates United Church to Wilsons Auctions, Trench Lock. See 23<sup>rd</sup> July – email from Oakengates Town Council and 26<sup>th</sup> July – email from Cllr Gilly Reynolds.

#### **APPENDIX B**

Please see the proposed polling station list (Appendix C) to be used at the next called election.

The 73 polling stations used for the last election held in Telford & Wrekin, the European Election on May 23<sup>rd</sup> 2019 will continue to be used. The four changes to proposed polling stations are:

Lawley Village Primary Academy to be replaced by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, The Crescent, Lawley. The change was brought about by an intention to move away from closing a primary school following complaints from parents.

St Patricks Catholic Primary School to be replaced by The Children's Centre, North Road, Wellington. The change to polling place was to move away from closing a primary school.

The Red Lion Annex, Holyhead Road, Wellington will not be used as a polling place due to the building being classed as unsuitable. The new venue will be the Sir John Bayley Club, Haygate Road, Wellington.

Ketley Bank Community Centre, Main Road, Ketley Bank is a Telford & Wrekin Council owned building which could be leased out/sold at any time so a replacement for this venue has been found at Queenswood Primary School, Yates Way, Ketley Bank. Staff are happy for elections to be held at this venue.
