

## Safer stronger neighbourhoods through the appropriate use of our enforcement powers



“Telford & Wrekin Council’s neighbourhood enforcement and public protection teams continue to keep residents, businesses, and visitors safe, adapting continuously to the new challenges a changing society brings with it.

“These teams work closely with police and other partners using intelligence, data and the views of residents to shape appropriate activities. The team also continues to secure external sources of funding in support of these commitments.

“The council is working to make things safer in every sense, from tackling fly-tippers, supporting victims of anti-social behaviour, educating people about parking around schools and ensuring food hygiene standards, right through to safer bars and clubs, taxis home and street lighting to make sure all neighbourhoods are great places to live.

“Keeping an eye over all of this and many other exercises, are two new closed-circuit television (CCTV) suites monitoring around 700 cameras and a fleet of enforcement vehicles.

“Our work has seen a 40% reduction in fly-tipping, 10% reduction in anti-social behaviour and 60 taxi license breaches issued as well as launching a pilot into taxi CCTV. Not only that, we’ve issued 189 fines for environmental crimes.”
