




# ICP strategy dashboard development update

#### Introduction

This update relates to the request to develop an Integrated Care Partnership (ICP) strategy dashboard covering the key ICP metrics, as determined by the planning group.







# **Summary**

This update covers version three of the dashboard, which is being developed by the Business Intelligence Team based at Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin ICB in close collaboration with the ICP leads and covers a series of metrics taken from the OHID Fingertips data tool, with acknowledgement that this list of metrics will likely grow and that other data sources may provide more timely data updates. As such this version of the tool is seen as proof-of-concept work in progress. Additionally, the tool has been developed with a view to expanding it out to cover additional high level reporting documents such as the annual report to increase the usage and value of the report.

The dashboard has been developed with a simple "**point and click**" feel to it and will include a home page, metadata page, a summary tab, a benchmarking and trend analysis tab and a gender analysis reporting tab.





## Home page

- The home page has been developed as a simple introduction page with a direct link to the metric page(s).
- To promote shared ownerships and working the organisational logos of all three partners have been used.
- Page could also be used to sign post other relevant strategy related dashboards such as the avoidable admissions dashboard and Health Inequalities dashboard.



# Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin Strategy dashboard




#### **Metrics tab**


