This move would not only strip our community of its local representation but would also create a significant democratic deficit, undermining the ability of us as residents to have a direct and meaningful say in the governance of our area.

Local democracy should be strengthened, not dismantled.

The residents of Dawley Hamlets deserve a voice. Our Parish Council is an essential part of that voice, and its abolition would be a significant loss to our community. I strongly oppose this proposal and call for a solution that safeguards our local representation, protects our identity, and upholds the principles of democratic engagement.
