






Value of our Local Nature Reserves: Recreation



Our LNRs receive 3.6 million visits a year



2.4 million visits a year are made via active travel



1.2 million visits a year are made by car



The Town Park, Dothill, Lightmoor, Rough Park, The Cockshutt, Dawley Hamlets and Apley Woods all receive over 200,000 visits a year



1.1 million visits a year are made by individuals who have never visited the LNR before



2.5 million visits a year are repeat visits



Delivering a welfare value of £12.4 million pounds per year (£24k p/ha)





Value of our Local Nature Reserves: Net Gain

Telfords 17 LNRs consist of 6819 biodiversity units (bu) - 12 bu per hectare Town Park, The Ercall, The Granville, Randlay Valley Support the highest number of bu 4174 bu of Woodland 1915 bu of grassland 376 bu of wetlands and lakes 354 bu of heath and scrub £75mill of biodiversity units £135k per ha - 10% net gain across the LNR series has the potential to lever £7.5mil over 25yrs (£300,000 p/yr)

Funding

- Utilised to focus immediate recovery actions as well as economic growth
- The Council is leading the recovery process and acting as a enabler / confidence builder in the local economy.
- The Council has promoted building efficiency grants and schemes for renovations and retrofits including improved insulation and heating.

Switch Telford

- White label energy comparison and switching site;
- Connected for Warmth (first time central heating),
- Launched the Telford Energy Advice Service.

Retrofit

- Council programme to retrofit schemes across Council owned buildings.
- For example, funding has been approved for PV at Oakengates Theatre, CO2 Emissions Avoided: 17775kg pa.



Green Recovery



- Working From Home: long-term impacts on the demand for office space.
- The Council are re-thinking existing office space which also reduces energy consumption.

- Ensure that strategic decisions drive green recovery
- Utilising the Local Plan Review to complement wide range of issues:
 - Including identify natural flood management approaches and Sustainable Drainage Systems (SuDS) to increase carbon sequestration.
